Greetings from Coyote Canyon! Summer is nearing the end and Journey's School is ramping up for an incredible 11th year. I have spent the summer reflecting on the years past and the years to come. Most poignant, I read a history about a school much like Journey's School, but thirty years older. The veteran (and original) head of school, when asked what to look for in a school, simply stated, "Do the faculty and staff love children?" Underlying the topics of excellence, innovation, and student engagement, this reminded me that every decision should be based on what is best for children. I have often said that I work at schools because I want to change the world. A daunting task, no doubt, but without the children at the forefront, this end goal is impossible.

The campus has been very active with Teton Science Schools' summer education programs. New faculty begin training today and all faculty return this coming Monday to plan for the 2011-12 academic year. We have a big year coming up as we evaluate, practice and refine all of our programs as part of a larger Curriculum Project and Strategic Plan. Some highlights include:

1. Revise our elementary school math program to include the Singapore Approach model.
2. Complete authorization for the International Baccalaureate Middle Years Program.
3. Graduate our first International Baccalaureate diploma candidates.
4. Begin implementation of our strategic plan (adopted this summer).
5. Complete alignment analysis and documentation of our entire program as part of a curriculum mapping project.

Many faculty have worked on curriculum design over the summer and are eager to start the year. To help the faculty implement the changes in both the Curriculum Project and the Strategic Plan, we are working with a variety of outside providers throughout the year, including:

1. Association for Supervision and Curriculum Design (ASCD)
2. Harcourt Math professional development training
3. Curriculum mapping training
4. Phi Delta Kappa International
5. International Baccalaureate

All of this energy reinforces our four programmatic pillars of academic excellence, extraordinary relationships, place-based education, and global citizenship. Most importantly, our faculty are more engaged than ever to create an extraordinary place of learning for your children.

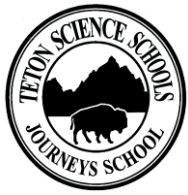

Pre-Kindergarten Supply List

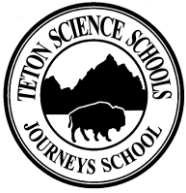
- **One** pair of comfortable indoor shoes that can be left at school (PLEASE label)
- Weather appropriate outdoor clothing (we go outside every day!) this includes but is not limited to: rain coat, snow boots, mittens, hat, snow pants, snow jacket
- Change of clothes bag that can be left in your child's cubby or is always in your child's backpack: one shirt, one pair of pants, underwear, one pair of socks (please label)

- Family photo to leave on display at school
- Backpack to carry all of their belongings
- A cd/copy of your child's favorite music or stories
- If your last name begins with A-M, please bring one package of each item: watercolors, Crayola Markers, gallon-sized Ziploc bags, tissues and hand soap
- If your last name begins with N-Z, please bring one package of each item: watercolor paper, Papermate black felt-tip pens, Viva Paper Towels, hand soap and sunscreen
- We are also collecting glass baby food jars with lids

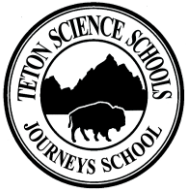

After School Explorations Program (Grades PreK-2)

The goal for the After School Explorations Program is to provide a safe and cooperative extended day program in which children can learn, explore, play, collaborate, and be creative. We are looking forward to another happy and successful afterschool program!

- **Description:** The After School Explorations Program is available to all students enrolled at Journey's School in grades PreK-2. The program is five days a week, Monday through Friday, from 3:30-5:30 pm. Each afternoon, the children receive snack, have free choice time for play and exploration, and participate in engaging and creative activities. This program is student centered, directed by their interests and energy, and is subject to change accordingly.
- **Schedule:** The After School Explorations Program follows the school calendar, beginning on the first day of school, August 31st, and continuing through the last day of the school year, June 12th. You may enroll for one day per week, all week, or even once a month.
- **Faculty:** Bree Buckley was a Teton Science Schools' summer instructor. We welcome her to the pre-kindergarten classroom and the After School Explorations Program.
- **Cost:** The cost for students who are pre-registered for the After School Explorations Program is \$15/day. The cost for drop-in is \$20/day and notification a day in advance is requested to assure we can include your child in our limited space program. Billing will be sent at the end of each trimester.
