Pennies for Patients Service Learning Project a huge SUCCESS! **April 25th - May 13th, 2011**

With the wonderful support of the Student Leadership Council, Journeys School students completed the first school-wide service learning project, Pennies for Patients. Pennies for Patients was a project in which students collected spare change to help those afflicted with blood cancers. For three weeks Pre-Kindergarten through 12th grade students competed to raise the most money for the Leukemia and Lymphoma Society in hopes of earning their level-specific incentive. The three week totals and totals per capita for each level are as follows:

Pre-K: \$374.09/\$13.36
***Elementary: \$1062.05/\$13.79**
Middle School: \$469.59/\$14.67
High School: \$602.59/\$14.69
***Faculty: \$633.13/\$21.10**

TOTAL: \$3148.85

FINAL TOTAL: \$3201.98
